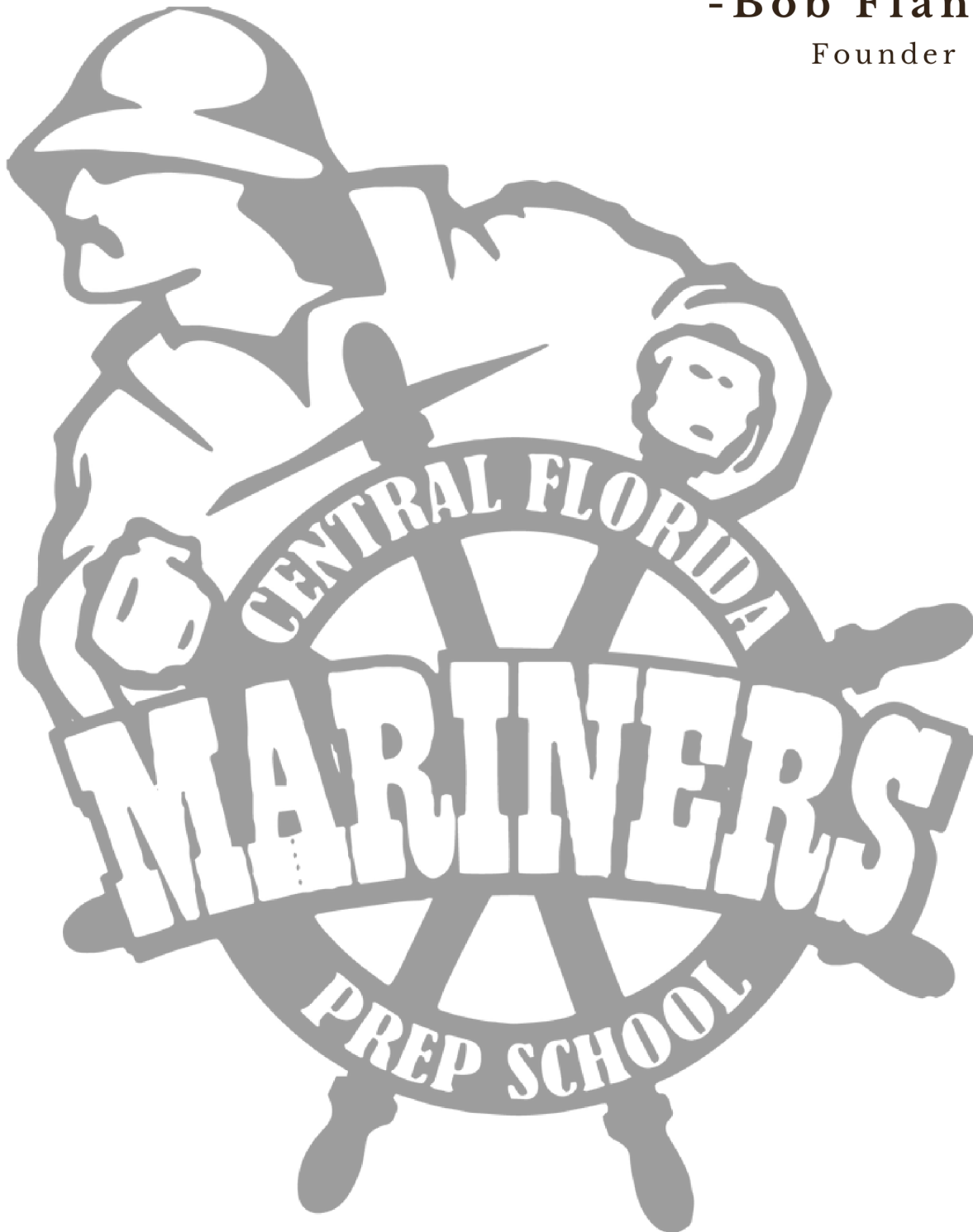

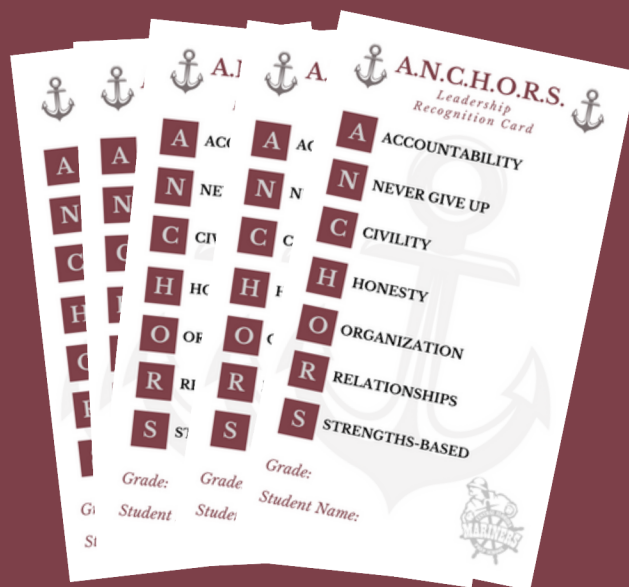

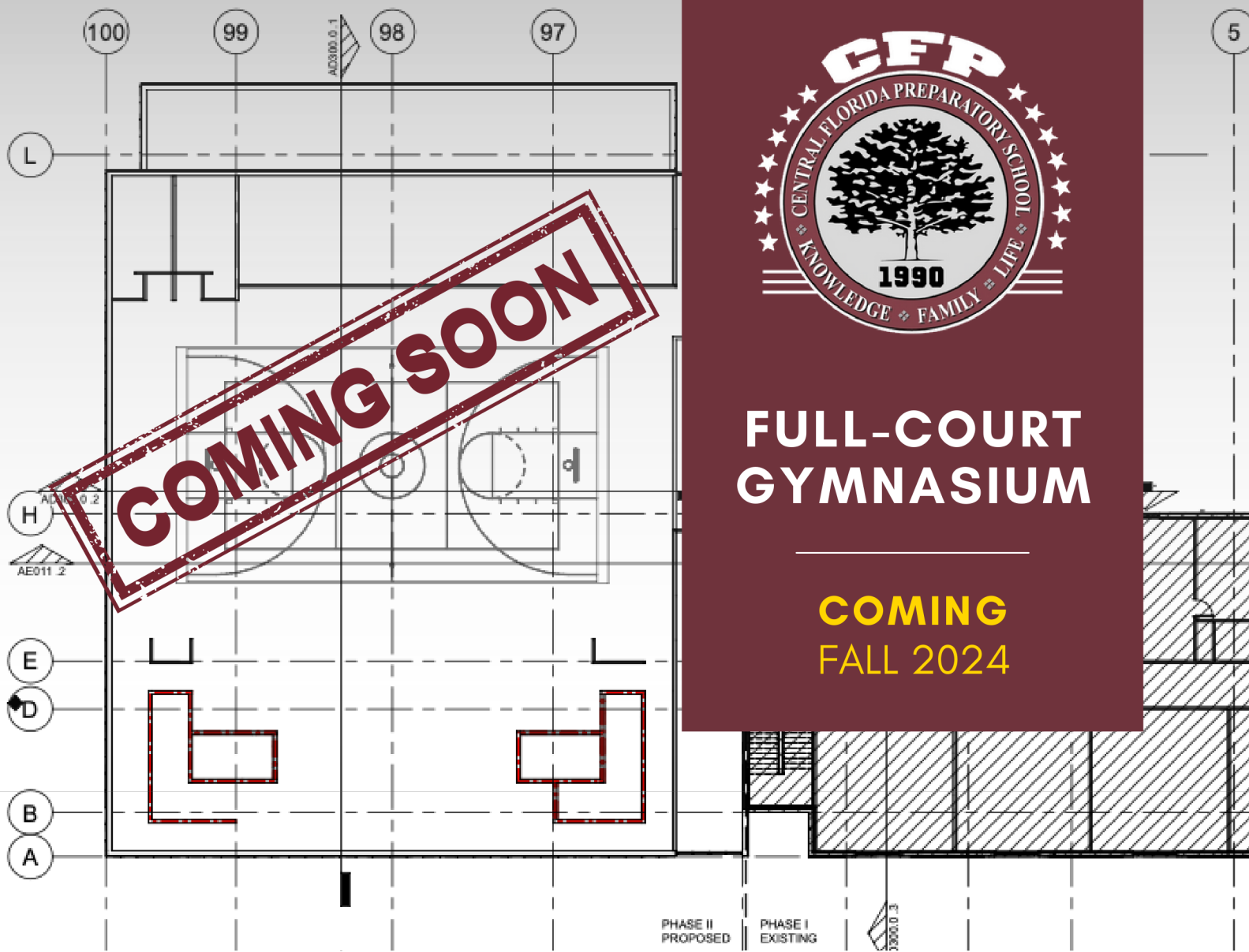

Phase 1 of our Outdoor Learning Experience brought an outdoor garden and two 8x16, fully solar powered greenhouses, which use both soil and hydroponic growing techniques. Phase 2, beginning in 2024, brings a full-scale outdoor classroom to our campus!

At A Plus Transportation we promote a safety culture. In doing so, we would like to share all pertinent information regarding our school bus safety features. Additionally, our proactive maintenance programs are designed to exceed districts' expectations for manufacturer service levels.

We use multi-function school activity buses (MFAB). We meet the same Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (FMVSS) as the yellow school bus transportation system.

1. Steel body cage
2. Side body impact protection
3. Child reminder system alarm
4. Reflective tape emergency exits
5. Lap seat belts
6. Fire extinguisher
7. First aid kit
8. Two emergency windows (1 per side)
9. One emergency back door

For parents with children under the age of 5, you may provide a car seat for your child if you feel comfortable (basic style car seat). However, the seat must remain on the bus during the school year.



The Montessori Way

Montessori is a philosophy of education developed by Italian doctor Maria Montessori in the early 1900s.

Montessori classrooms are mixed-aged classrooms containing students ages 3-6. Dr. Montessori believed that children experience different stages of readiness that create windows of opportunity for learning. She called these stages sensitive periods of learning. Each Montessori classroom is divided into five distinct areas. Those areas are: Practical Life, Sensorial, Math, Language, and Culture. The individuality of the child is highly prized in Montessori, and children all work at their own pace in each area.



Lower School

CFP provides a learning environment that incorporates a variety of teaching techniques while accommodating individual learning styles. Starting in elementary, our curriculum builds proficiency in higher order thinking skills, literacy, technology, and computational and theoretical processes, while nurturing artistic, physical, and interpersonal development. Elementary students utilize Project Lead the Way curricula.

Project Lead The Way empowers students with problem-solving strategies, critical and creative thinking skills, communication and collaboration, and perseverance and prepares teachers to engage their students in hands-on learning. Whether designing and producing prosthetics or deploying innovative water filtration devices in developing countries, PLTW students and the teachers who support them are empowered to make a difference in their classrooms, in their communities, and around the world.



SPECIAL PROGRAMS

STEM - Agriculture - Spanish - Art Performing Arts - PE

Lower school students have many opportunities to explore the world around them through CFP's unique special programs. Our STEM lab boasts stations such as 3D printing, and robotics. Outdoor raised garden beds allow students to have hands-on farm-to-table experiences. Every CFP student is given the chance to interact with real-world scenarios and challenges and to create and design their own solutions. The goal with our special programs is to bring innovation to education by continually stimulating students' passions, interests, and problem-solving skills.





Upper School Classes

All of our high school graduates are accepted to the colleges and universities of their choice. CFP high schoolers graduate as well-rounded citizens ready to take on the world. Graduates who began Central Florida Preparatory School as Montessori students and moved up through our grades have many advantages. The required registration fee and tuition insurance fee, both non-refundable, are required upon enrollment. Upon acceptance by CFP, CFP enrolls the child and reserves the student's place for the corresponding school year. The party responsible for the student agrees to make all payments as detailed in the Tuition Policies.

Enrollment is made for the entire school year. Fees are due and payable by June 1. For the convenience of parents/guardians, tuition is divided into eleven equal payments, payable the first of each month. The first payment is due by July 1. The final payment is due by May 1. All accounts must be settled before transcripts and records can be released. Accounts that are past due over 30 days will be cause to immediate suspension at the school's discretion.

State Scholarship Acknowledgements

It is the sole responsibility of the parent/guardian to apply for any/all available scholarships and to meet all applicable deadlines. Central Florida Preparatory School will not be held responsible for any missed state scholarship application deadlines, incomplete applications, missing applications documents or anything else required for state scholarship applications. Regardless of the status of student's state scholarship, student's tuition remains the responsibility of the parent/guardian and shall always be billed to the parent/guardian directly. If student's state scholarship is denied or reduced, parent/guardian is responsible for any/all tuition not paid by scholarship.

Visit www.factsmgt.com. Select **Parent Log In** from the menu bar and then **FACTS Family Portal** from the drop-down menu.

② Step 2

Log in to the Family Portal. If you have forgotten your username or password, please click on the link provided.

③ Step 3

After the Family Portal loads, click on **Apply/Enroll** in the left menu. Click on the **Enrollment/Reenrollment** link.

④ Step 4

The **online enrollment** system will open with a link for your child. The online enrollment process will take approximately 15 minutes to complete. Your information will be saved if you need to quit and come back later.

① Step 1

If you are new to CFP, please visit www.factsmgt.com to set up your Family Portal account. Select **Parent Log In** from the menu bar and then **FACTS Family Portal** from the drop-down menu. After the FACTS Family Portal Log In screen loads, select **Create New Family Portal Account**.

② Step 2

In the District Code field, enter **CF-FL**. In the email address field, please enter the same email address provided in your school application. Click **Create Account**.

③ Step 3

You will receive an email from FACTS SIS Customer Support containing a link that will allow you to create your username and password. For security purposes the link will remain active for 6 hours. Please check your spam folder if you do not receive the email.

Click on the link in the email. You will be directed to the **Create/Change Password** screen. You may use the provided default username or create a new one. Enter your desired username and password. Click **Save Username and/or Password**. You may now close the window.

④ Step 4

Repeat Step 1 using your new username and password to **log into the Family Portal**.

Middle School

Homework time is allotted in our campus STEM Lab, snack time (provided from home), a selection of group/social or individual games, option for outdoor field time after homework.

WHAT TO EXPECT AFTER ENROLLMENT

Welcome to the Central Florida Prep Family!

You will receive an acceptance letter following the submission of all required registration documents and fees. Before your child's first day, here are a few things you'll want to know about our process to ensure they're most prepared for a productive and successful experience.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Where can I order uniforms?

All school uniforms must be purchased through our approved uniform vendor, Pointer Printing. Schedule an appointment at www.pointerprinting.com to try on and order uniforms. Until you receive your official CFP gear, students are allowed to wear plain burgundy, black, blue, or white polo shirts. Boys and girls can wear khaki shorts or pants. Girls can also choose to wear a khaki skort. For Physical Education, we ask that students wear solid burgundy shorts with a black or gray t-shirt. Students are required to follow uniform guidelines while waiting for orders to be received.

Where do I get my car loop tag?

You'll receive a car tag for car loop drop-off and pick-up during our FACTS Parent Training Session or at Meet the Teacher. If you did not receive a car tag during either event, please email our Montessori Directress at epierson@cfprep.org.

Where do I find my child's schedule?

If your child is in middle or high school, they will receive their schedule during Meet the Teacher. Please note that middle and high school students must choose an elective prior to their schedule being created or they will be placed in the first available elective. If you have not selected your child's elective class, please email your selection to jnajera@cfprep.org.

How does my child get their laptop?

A laptop will be provided to your child within the first week of school. Students that enroll after the beginning of the school year will receive a laptop within 48 hours of the start

date. Please make sure your student has signed the Computer and Internet Policy Agreement, found in your enrollment packet.

How does my child get their login information?

Our Technology Department will email your student and parent login information for Schoology and FACTS within the same time frame that the laptop is received.

Where do I drop off for before and after care?

Drop-off for Before Care is located in the back of the building, next to the playground. Please ring the doorbell located on the exterior door frame. After Care pick up will be at the front doors of the school beginning at 3:45 p.m.

What are my child's lunch options?

Students may purchase a hot lunch from the CFP cafeteria for \$6.50 through FACTS or pack a lunch from home that does not require heating.

Where do I drop off school supplies?

Supplies for your child's classroom should be brought to Meet the Teacher.

When are tuition payments due?

All tuition payments are due on the first of the month through FACTS. Payments received after the 7th of the month are assessed a \$30 late fee.

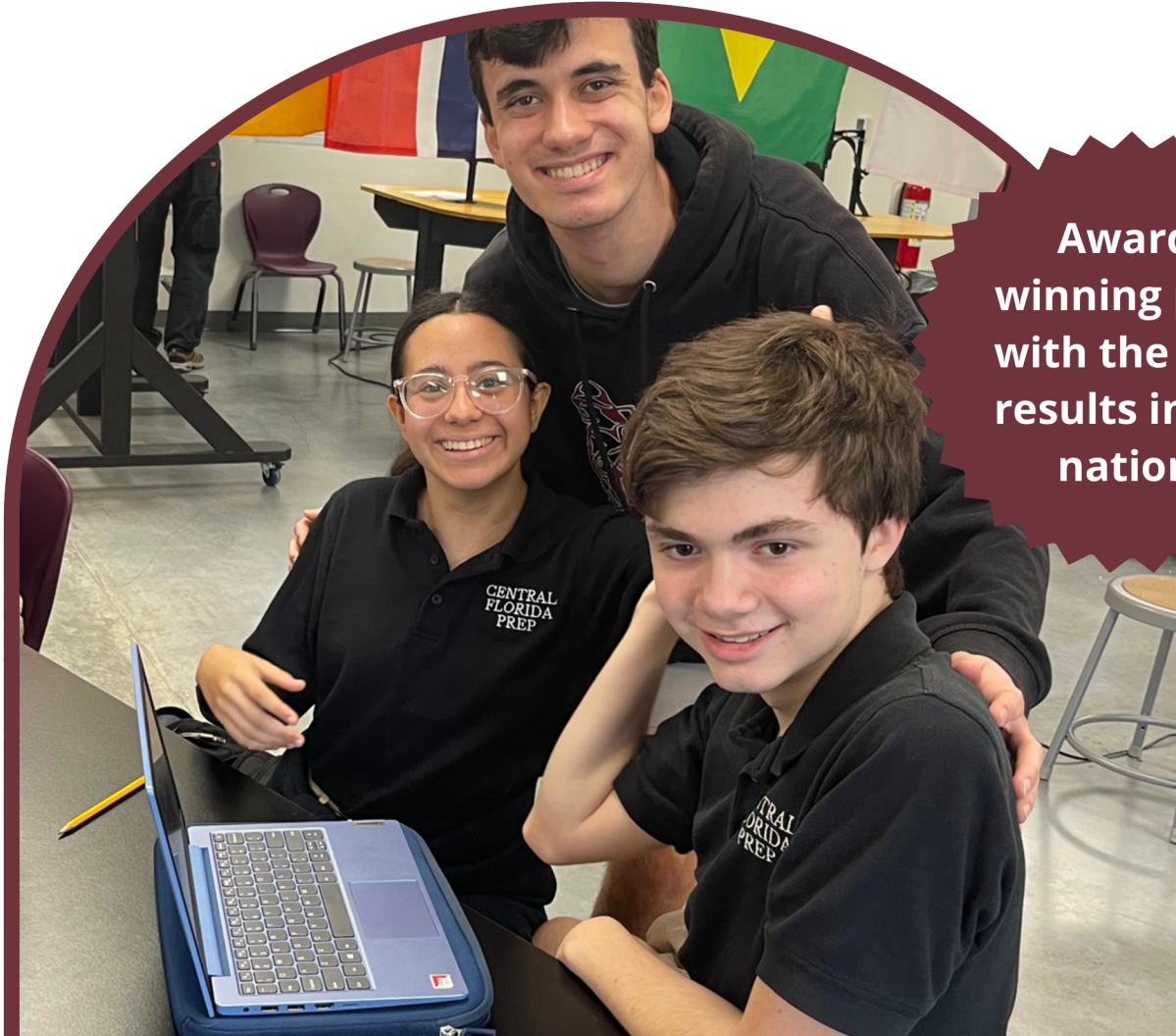
